Dear Mrs Gunn:

Not being satisfied with the letters from the War Department about our sons, I have for twenty-one months been making my own investigation and have decided to make a search for my son, myself. Enclosed is one of the circulars I had printed to use in that search. I have already sent overseas hundreds of them and am hoping I may hear something soon. In view of the fact that there are still missing, thousands of men from the 12th and 15th Air Forces in Italy and that Russia has more than 3 million prisoners I thought it possible, some of the men could be mixed with the prisoners, including our sons. Anyway I have sent the circulars over in hopes that somebody somewhere may know something and write and tell me. If my son is alive I want him back, if he is dead I want proof and I am not taking the War Department's word for it. If I get any news of the boys or the plane I'll let you know at once. (over)

Here's hoping for luck.
